PRYOR ROAD DEVELOPMENT

Drake Development took over this project from Christy Development. This project is now identified as: "Streets of West Pryor." The latest plans for the project are as follows: Add a 1.5-acre lake at corner of Chipman and Pryor which will cover part of the current walking trail. Add parking to Lowenstein Park between already existing parking lots. Add permanent year-round restrooms. Add 2 hotels (across from Jack Stack.) Add new-to-market grocer, restaurant(s) and retail stores. Add 400 4-story apartments and single-story family senior living villas (across from Summerfield.) Power lines will be moved to parallel Pryor Road. The developer is still working with the City Planning Commission with the next official public meeting scheduled for October.

ROCK ISLAND TRAIL

The Rock Island Trail is a shared use path that is just west of BTB. This trail is a new public use path for hiking, walking and biking. When completed this shared use path will extend approximately 14 miles from south Lee's Summit to the Truman Sports Complex. Included on the path is Vale Tunnel (under Bannister Road) which was completed in 1904 and is over 400 feet long. Although not officially open, the trail is mostly completed from Hartman Park to just past Vale Tunnel at Bannister Road. Trailheads are planned at Hartman Park and Paragon Star (470 and View High.) There will also be access to the trail from Chipman Road via on/off ramps to be constructed during the Chipman tunnel renovation (scheduled to start early 2019). Eventually this trail segment will connect with the Rock Island Trail at Pleasant Hill, which connects to the Katy Trail at Windsor.

SOME FALL TIPS-PREPPING FOR WINTER

•Clean/de-gunk gutters and downspouts. Make sure all drainage areas are unblocked by leaves and debris.

•To prevent water pipes from bursting when temperatures get below freezing, turn off the valves to exteriors hoses. Remove hoses from faucets. Run water until pipes are empty (if water remains in pipes it can freeze and damage pipes.)

•Drain and turn off sprinkler system before freezing temperatures occur.

•Check out your roof and chimney for any damage from summer storms.

•Look-up chimney for blockages, check damper.

•This is a good time to seal cracks around doors and windows before colder weather hits.

•Check and perform furnace maintenance before colder temperatures transpire.

NEIGHBORHOOD REMINDERS

- Keeping outside lights on at night can help discourage crime.
- Lock your car doors to aid in avoiding theft (never leave cars unattended while running.)
- Please continue watch out for children playing, riding bikes!

•It is back to school time, please watch for children at bus stops and make sure you stop your vehicle when the bus is letting off and picking up children!

• Please submit all exterior home improvement projects to the Architectural Committee for approval before you start work. The forms are available on



the BTB website at www.benttreebluffs.com and can be submitted to: benttreebluffshoa@gmail.com for review or specific contact information about where to send forms. This may include, but not limited to the following projects: roofs, paint, siding, fence, deck and landscape changes [Article VI.]

• No overnight parking on the streets. No long term storage of boats, RB's, or trailers on driveways, streets, or lots [Article VIII, (d) 4 & 5.]

• Please clean up after pets.

• Homeowners are urged to keep yard waste and all other waste out of the storm sewers. There have been back-ups in BTB storm sewers after excess leaves and grass had been going down the drain over a period of time.
