

Streets of West Pryor Update:

Matt Pennington, president of Drake Development, has met with representatives from Bent Tree Bluffs and Summerfield to give updates on progress and changes in the plans for the Streets of West Pryor project. BTB residents will be glad to know that the fountain and waterfalls being installed at the pond at the corner of Pryor and Chipman are due to be completed by Thanksgiving. The level of the pond will be raised sometime later and is supposed to cover the rocks surrounding the pond. McKeever's Market, First Watch, and the Supplement Superstore have already opened. Firebirds is due to open on November 8th. The building to the left of McKeever's will house a Starbucks and a BIBIBOP Asian Grill. The building behind McKeever's is a 4-story building housing 232 1- and 2-bedroom apartments with underground parking.



Originally the development plan included a 4-story apartment building on Lowenstein across from the park. This has been changed to a 3-story apartment building. There will also be 2-story townhouses going in on the east and north side of the ponds next to Lowenstein. Matt has plans to fill in the mines below the area where the townhouses will be before he begins construction. It is hoped that filling in the mines will decrease the vibrations that we have been feeling from the blasting by Star Excavation northwest of 470 and Pryor. See the map on the next page.



BTB Trail Connecting to Rock Island Trail

There has been much discussion both on the BTB Facebook page and at the HOA meeting regarding creating a trail that will join our subdivision to the Rock Island Trail. Many homeowners were surprised that people could walk in the forested common area behind many of the homes in BTB. There have been two proposed locations for trails. One would start in between 921 and 925 Bent Tree Drive where there is a strip of land belonging to BTB for access to the common area. The other would start on Overbrook across from the pond and follow the creek and eventually arrive at the Rock Island Trail.



Homeowners opposing the trails are concerned about cars parking at the trailheads, strangers entering the neighborhood resulting in increased crime, and losing privacy in their backyards. An additional concern is the cost of establishing and maintaining the trails.

BTB Trail Connecting to Rock Island Trail (cont.)

Those approving the trails point to the fact that most desirable new neighborhoods include walking trails in their amenities. These amenities add to the value of their homes. Several BTB homeowners showed great interest in having trails through the woods. Many people from BTB walk the Winterset trails through the woods, and they have never seen cars parked at the trailheads. The Winterset HOA says they have had no problems with crime or traffic from their trail system.

The issue has been tabled until we can do more research.

Pond News

At the Homeowners Meeting, the Pond Committee reported that they have budgeted \$1000 to add fish to the ponds. The fish kill that occurred a few years ago resulted in killing off nearly all the fish in the upper pond and many in the lower two ponds. A representative from the Missouri Conservation Dept. believes the fish kill occurred because of chemicals entering the ponds probably through our storm drains. For that reason the committee has decided to purchase minnows, bass, and crappies. They will also add a few grass carp to help control the weeds. Fifty percent of the fish will be added to the upper pond. The remaining fifty percent will be divided into the lower ponds. Adding the fish this fall will allow the fish to grow over the winter so that we can have good fishing next spring. The Pond Committee also feels that they have finally come up with an effective formula for chemical treatment to deal with weeds in the ponds. Thank you to Randy Naylor, Gary Denny and Lynn Canning--our Pond Committee!

Blasting Update

There have been at least three incidents where the blasting from Star Excavation north and west of I-470 and Pryor have exceeded the 133-decibel limit. Linda Marshall has contacted the Department of Fire Safety and spoken with Deputy Chief Grass who apparently didn't understand that his department was in charge of enforcing the limit. She plans to write to the Director of the Department of Fire Safety. She also has a call into the Governor's office. If necessary, she may contact the press to see that this issue is being properly handled.

BTB Enhancements

This summer several enhancements were installed throughout our neighborhood. Part of the thinking was to add some outdoor things to do during the COVID-19 pandemic. New features include 2 picnic tables on the lower pond, 2 tetherball poles (one at the pool and one on Overbrook across from the pond), a basketball goal in the pool parking lot, 2 soccer goals and a volleyball net in the common area in the High Point loop. Thanks to Randy & Kim Naylor who assembled and installed all the equipment. Enjoy!

BTB Reminders

- There have been several sightings of strangers looking into cars parked on driveways. Lock your car doors to prevent possible theft and remove any valuable items!
- Never leave cars unattended while running, even to warm up.
- Keeping outside lights on at night can help discourage crime.
- Please watch out for children playing, riding bikes, scooters, etc.
- Watch for children at bus stops and make sure you stop your vehicle when the bus is letting off and picking up children!
- Homeowners are urged to keep yard waste, dog excrement, and all other waste out of the storm sewers. Storm sewers on the upper part of High Point flow into our ponds. Chemical waste will damage the ponds. Also there have been back-ups in BTB storm sewers from excess leaves and grass going down the storm drains over a period of time.
- Please clean up after pets when walking through the neighborhood.
- No overnight parking on the streets. No long-term storage of boats, RV's, or trailers on driveways, streets, or lots [Article VIII, (d) 4 & 5.]
