SPRING TIME HOME MAINTENANCE TIPS FROM HGTV

•Examine roof shingles to see if any were lost or damaged during the winter months. Have a qualified roofer check the flashing around plumbing vents, skylights and chimneys.

•Probe wood trim: use a screwdriver to probe the wood trim around windows, doors, railings and decks. Make repairs before the spring rains do more damage to exposed wood.

•Check the Gutters: for loose or leaky gutters. Clean the gutters from debris. Improper drainage from gutters can lead to water inside the home. Make sure the downspouts are draining away from the foundation.

•Use compacted soil in low areas of the yard and next to the foundation of your home. Spring rains can cause flooding, this can reduce flood damage to your home and help keep insect breeding out of the yard (breeding of insects can occur when water pools are created in low areas of your yard.)

• Check your chimney! Examine the exterior for any damage, have the flue cleaned and inspected by a certified chimney sweep.

•Inspect concrete slabs for signs of cracks or movement. All exterior concrete slabs should be drained away from the foundation (except pool decks.) Fill cracks with concrete crack filler or silicone caulk. Power-wash and seal concrete.

•Move firewood that has been stored near the home away. Firewood should always be stored at least 18 inches off the ground and at least 2 feet from any structure.

•Check your outside faucets for any possible freeze damage. Turn the water on and place your thumb or finger over the opening, if you can stop the flow of water, there may be a pipe damaged and may need replacing. Check the garden hose for any dry rot.

•Have your AC unit services and cleaned by a qualified heating and cooling contractor. Clean coils operate more efficiently. An annual service can keep the system working at peak performance levels. Change the filters on a regular basis.

•Check all your gas and battery powered lawn equipment to make sure it ready for use. Clean and sharp equipment make yardwork easier.

NEIGHBORHOOD REMINDERS

•Keeping outside lights on at night can help discourage crime.

•Lock your car doors to prevent possible theft.

•Never leave cars unattended while running, even to warm up.

•Please watch out for children playing, riding bikes, scooters, etc.

•It is still the school year: Watch for children at bus stops and make sure you stop your vehicle when the bus is letting off and picking up children!

•Please, clean up after pets when walking through the neighborhood.

BTB SPOTLIGHT!



BTB's Daniel Worth became the Missouri State Champion in the 100-yard Breastroke with a time of 53.53. Daniel has been featured in the Kansas City Star and Swimming World Magazine for breaking a 28-year state record previously held by Jeff Commings (1991.) The links of these articles will be listed at the bottom of this feature. Daniel also took first place in the 200 yard Individual Medley (IM,) the 200 yard Medley Relay and 200 yard Freestyle Relay with his teammates. Further, the 200-yard Relay broke a state record. Check out some information you may not have known about Daniel:

Daniel was 17 years old and in the 11th grade at Lee's Summit North High School when he crushed a 28-year state record in the 100-yard Breaststroke. Daniel swam for the BTB neighborhood league for a couple years when he was in elementary school (as did his siblings before him) and then began swimming competitively for 6 years before crushing the record. Daniel told the Lee's Summit R-7 School District he had been trying to break the time of the record, which had provided motivation for him for the last two years. Daniel had done extensive training and put in a lot of work both physically and mentally to break the state record. This training included pool work nine times a week and lifting weights four times a week. Three months of the year, Daniel trains with the high school team and the other nine months he works with his competitive club team. Daniel likes to think about race strategy while listening to music through headphones as a "pre-race ritual;" that playlist usually includes screamo and hype music. Right now Daniel is competing in the Junior Nationals and looking forward to committing to a college, where we know he will
